SAFETY

Exercise caution while in Dili, Timor-Leste. This includes:

- Avoid travelling alone at night,
- Being mindful of your belongings at all times,
- All traffic operates on the left side of the road. Be careful with crossing the road. Sparse or non-existent lighting and poor road conditions make driving and walking at night hazardous.

TRAVEL AND MEDICAL

It is strongly recommended that all delegates:

- Obtain comprehensive travel and medical insurance before travelling to Timor-Leste.
- Seek a travel doctor's advice on recommended vaccinations for Timor-Leste.
- Avoid contact with animals. In the event of an animal bite or scratch, seek urgent medical advice. Rabies has recently been detected in rural Timor-Leste is fatal without post-exposure treatment, recommended within 24 hours of exposure. Rabies post-exposure treatment includes vaccinations and, if necessary, immunoglobulin treatment. Post-exposure treatment is limited in Timor-Leste, this could require medical evacuation to Australia. Ensure your travel and medical insurance covers this.
- Malaria and other mosquito-borne diseases can be found in Timor-Leste. Dengue is endemic in Timor-Leste, peaking in the monsoon season. Recommend obtaining anti-malaria medications and insect repellent with DEET before travelling to Timor-Leste.
- Waterborne, foodborne and other infectious diseases are widespread. These include gastroenteritis, typhoid and hepatitis. Drink only boiled or bottled water. Avoid raw or undercooked food. It is recommended not to consume street food.

Severe Weather Conditions

Timor-Leste is prone to these natural disasters including tsunami, earthquakes, cyclones, tropical storms, and flash flooding. Keep abreast of updates through these websites or apps.
